Gisela was born in Frankfurt am Main, Germany. She studied piano and cello in Frankfurt and piano solo in Weimar. In London, she obtained a Masters in Performance (accompaniment) at the GSMD. Gisela's subsequent work as accompanist brought her to the path of singing, and she took up singing professionally in 2014, studying privately with Jessica Cash for several years. Gisela is a freelance musician and teacher and also works as tutor for the City Lit institute, teaching several musical subjects.

Tom sang as a Winchester College Quirister from the age of 8. While studying with Nick Salwey at Winchester College, he gained an FTCL diploma in piano performance. After graduating from St Peter's College Oxford, Tom has worked as a piano teacher and accompanist. Tom has just completed a masters course in piano accompaniment at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, studying with Pamela Lidiard and Iain Burnside. In March last year, Tom won the <u>Paul Harmburger\*</u> Prize for Voice and Piano, accompanying baritone George Robarts. Tom accompanies for the Encore Choir, directed by Charles MacDougal, the City Chamber Choir, directed by Stephen Jones, and the Hampshire Youth Choirs, directed by Kerry Kenward and Andrew Hayman. Tom works as music director of StMary's church in Islington, and works as an accompanist and teacher at the Guildhall, where he is a junior fellow.
